Meet **Marty Bowling, '68**USMA Admissions Field Force Officer

"A LIVING LEGACY"

Martin (Marty) Bowling's life has been characterized by a commitment to Duty, Honor, and Country, values instilled in him during his years at West Point, Class of 1968. Marty is a Vietnam combat veteran and after leaving the Army with a medical disability, he was a successful executive in the energy industry.

Marty met his wife Barbara on a blind date during his cow year while he was on an exchange weekend at the U.S. Coast Guard Academy, where Barbara's father was stationed. Marty and Barbara married 16 months later in 1969 following Barbara's graduation from the University of Connecticut. While at West Point, Marty was the recipient of a National Fellowship and went on to obtain three post graduate degrees from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in Nuclear Engineering and Political Science and later an MBA from the University of Richmond.

One of Marty's key contributions to West Point lies in his role as an **Admissions Field Force Officer**, coordinating the northern half of the WPSN footprint in SWFL. Marty coordinates FL17 (Charlotte and Sarasota Counties) and serves in FL16 and FL18 (Manatee, Glades, and Hendry Counties). Marty also coordinates three other districts (FL03, FL06, FL07) and serves in two others (FL11, NY03).

Your Board gratefully anticipates the continued support and active participation of each member as we venture into the next chapter of our journey. I wish you all a happy and fulfilling 2024!

Marty's passion for ensuring that West Point receives dedicated and capable candidates is evident in his commitment to recruiting and mentoring candidates through the admissions process. "My most important legacy to the Academy is the candidates I have recruited and mentored and who have successfully graduated from West Point," Marty emphasized.

currently at West Point including 3 of the firsties mentioned in this newsletter. In addition, he has helped a number of candidates enter USMAPS and about 10 former candidates who ultimately chose a different Academy. As of this January, Marty already has 6 SWFL candidates (13 overall) with offers or who have accepted for the Class of 2028 and expects to end up with several more SWFL candidates (15 or more overall) entering West Point this July out of the more than 87 candidates in his SWFL districts that have applied. He is also actively working with pre-candidates for the Class of 2029, who can start their application on February 1, 2024 to enter the Academy in July 2025.

His mentoring approach for West Point candidates reveals the depth of his dedication. Marty navigates the complexities of the admissions process, emphasizing the importance of connecting with candidates and their parents, addressing concerns, and showcasing the unique attributes of West Point. Marty shared that the admissions process has dramatically changed from when he completed his entrance exams at Fort Moore, GA (formerly Fort Benning) in a single weekend for the SAT, fitness test, medical exam and interview. Now the application process requires more

information and may take up to a year or more. Marty is often asked by graduates and others whether the academic standards have been lowered since he attended. His answer is "the candidates now entering the academy are well qualified academically and the academic standard is higher than when he applied".

Marty emphasized the importance of gaining candidates' trust and providing ongoing support throughout the long admissions process. For a "senior" person and stranger to gain trust with 16 and 17 year-olds and their parents is tricky but critical, especially when distance precludes face-to-face interactions. But by helping candidates overcome the many obstacles and personal challenges that almost every candidate faces during the application process, he develops a trusting and long-lasting relationship.

As Marty reflects on his career and life successes, he attributes much of it to the formative years spent at West Point. He and Barbara shared that "We believe we should do all we can to help and support outstanding young men and women who want to go to West Point and develop into leaders of character to protect and serve our country". His financial gifts to the Academy support cadets in obtaining a "world view" through AOG supported programs. As an Admissions Field Force Officer, he has been able to help candidates not just get through the application process but also make the commitment to become leaders in service to the nation. In summary, Marty finds his involvement with these fine and talented young people to be very rewarding. He calls them his "Living Legacy".

Meet Thomas Kochevar, a distinguished graduate of Pine View School in Osprey, FL, whose journey from the classrooms of high school led him to the hallowed halls of West Point. Originally in Company G-2 before scrambling to E-1, Tom has left an indelible mark during his time at the Academy. His dedication and prowess shine brightly as a key member of the Army Pistol Team, contributing to the team's triumphant



victories over Navy in all three years of his active participation. Tom's exceptional skills were duly honored when he was recognized in 2023 with Honorable Mention All-American Pistol, a testament to his commitment to excellence in sportsmanship.

Beyond the firing range, Tom's academic pursuits showcase his intellectual curiosity and commitment to advancing technology. His independent research delves into enhancing the Linux network stack, with aspirations to publish his findings. As part of his Capstone Project, he is focusing on safeguarding industrial machinery from both power and cyber threats, showcasing a dedication to applying his knowledge to real-world challenges.

Tom's leadership extends beyond the academic realm, with experiences ranging from Air Assault School to a CTLT assignment in Armor at Joint Base Lewis-McChord where he was assigned to a Stryker Cavalry Troop. His cadet leadership roles have included Beast Squad Leader, cadet company Platoon Leader, and he is currently serving as both the Company Store Officer and Company Trunk Room Officer. Reflecting his commitment to serving at the forefront of cybersecurity and technological defense, Tom eagerly anticipates being a Lieutenant, aspiring to be a 17D, Cyber Capabilities Development Officer, or a 17A, Cyber Warfare Officer.

Meet Ryan Logan, a remarkable individual whose journey from Island Coast High School in Cape Coral, FL, to the prestigious West Point is nothing short of inspiring. Graduating in 2020 with a clear sense of purpose, Ryan, originally in Company D-1 before scrambling to A-4, embarked on a four-year adventure that revolved around his passion for robotics. In 2023, as the captain of the



Robotics Team, he led his team to competitions at the Kennedy Space Center in NASA's Lunabotics Mining Competition, showcasing his dedication to pushing the boundaries of innovation. Ryan's commitment to academic excellence is evident through his participation in Academic Individual Advanced Development (AIAD) programs at Picatinny Arsenal and Adelphi Army Research Laboratory (ARL). His focus on swarm robotics and autonomous systems reflects a keen interest in cutting-edge technology. Notably, his work was recognized at the ARL-USMA Technical Symposium at Aberdeen Proving Grounds, demonstrating his contributions to the field.

Beyond his academic pursuits, Ryan's involvement in the United States Special Operations Command's Ignite at MIT Lincoln Labs showcases his dedication to finding practical solutions to real-world challenges. Currently leading an Astrobotic Capstone, he is pioneering the development of an autonomous mining system for NASA's Lunabotics Competition, leaving an indelible mark on the intersection of robotics and space exploration. As a Platoon Leader in his final semester and a future Aviator, Ryan branched into Aviation due to the inspiration and legacy of his grandfather, CW3 Logan, a Vietnam Veteran aviator.

Highlights of West Point's Physical Pillar –
The Indoor Obstacle Course Test (IOCT)

One of the hallmarks of West Point's physical education program has always been the Cadet Indoor Obstacle Course Test (IOCT). Initially administered in 1944 as a more robust evaluation of a cadet's physical ability, the course has undergone various iterations. Still required as part a cadet's physical program, the course currently consists of 11 events - low crawl under barrier, tire footwork, two-handed vault, 8 ft horizontal shelf, horizontal bar navigation, hanging tire, balance beam, 8 ft vertical wall, 20 ft horizontal ladder, 16 ft vertical rope, and 350 m sprint (carrying a 6 lb. medicine ball for the first 120 m, a baton for the second 120 m, and empty-handed for the remaining 110 m). The IOCT is still administered in Hayes Gym today!




