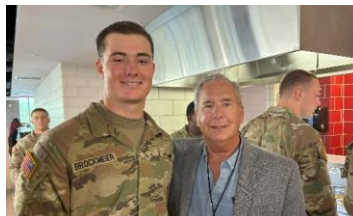
What I Did This Summer:

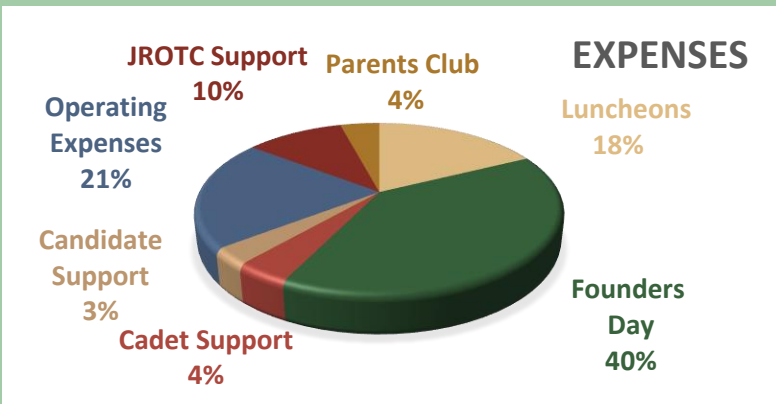
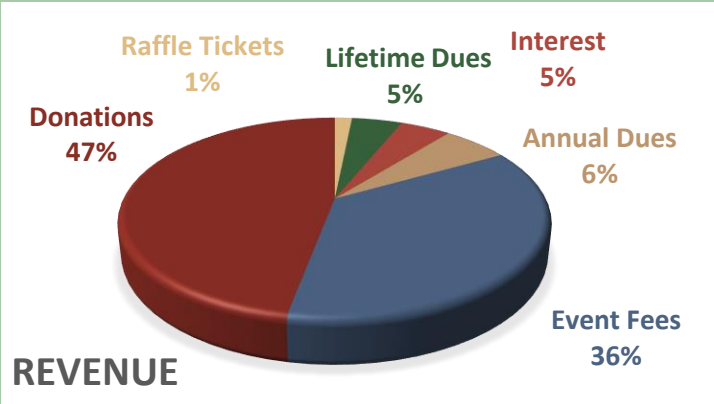
Our Long-term Financial Goal

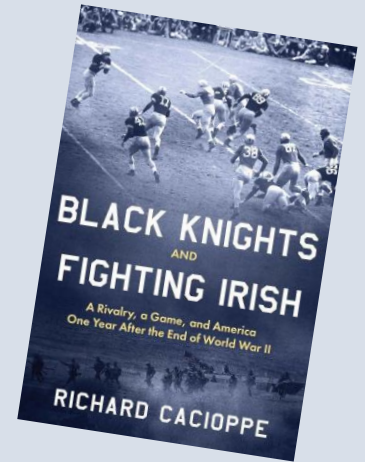

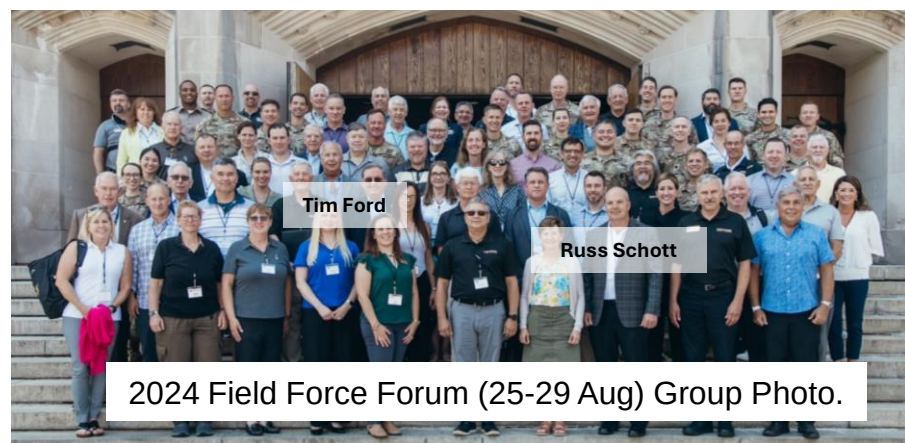

The West Point Admissions Department hosted approximately 70 field force volunteers from throughout the U.S. and Puerto Rico at West Point for their premier training event, the Annual Field Force Forum. Members of the field force are volunteers who help to identify and recruit highly qualified high school students for the Academy. The goal of the SWFL field force, with support from the West Point Society of Naples, is to help identify SWFL's most promising students and mentor them in achieving the exceptional honor of being accepted for admission to West Point. Volunteers come from many circles to include current or former active-duty grads, retirees, family members of grads or in general, anyone who is interested in finding and mentoring the best of the best in SWFL to be future cadets at West Point.

This year Tim Ford ('79) and Russ Schott ('91'), representing Florida Congressional District 19, attended the Forum. The event included briefings from the Supe, the Com, the Dean, DMI, DPE, and USMAPS, among many other admissions related briefings. Members of the field force spend time meeting with prospective cadets and families, attend college fairs, or even host admissions briefings in the local area, but they mostly mentor and guide prospective candidates in developing a strong competitive resume. In February of their junior year students can then begin applying to West Point. This Field Force Forum training provides the expertise to appropriately guide and mentor these students through the rigorous admissions process as they pursue joining the Long Gray Line.

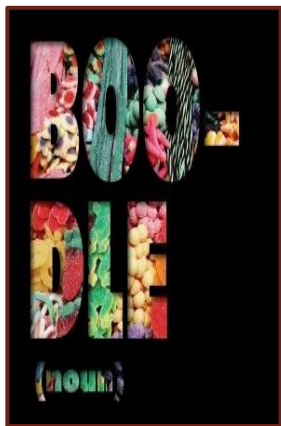

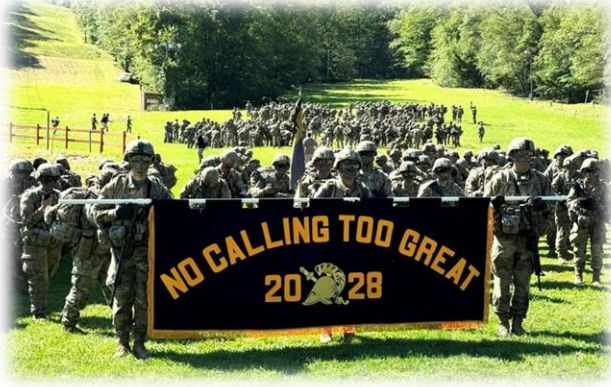

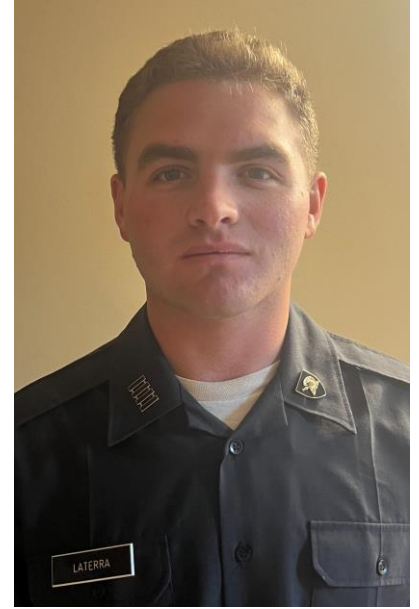
MEET A SWFL CADET

Jack Lattera

Academic Major: Geospatial Information Science



Jack Lattera, a 2020 graduate of Barron Collier High School in Naples, has been making his mark at the United States Military Academy at West Point. After spending a year at Marion Military Institute as part of the USMA Civil Prep program, Jack earned his appointment and entered West Point in 2021 as a member of the Class of 2025.

Throughout his time at West Point, Jack has demonstrated a commitment to both academic excellence and leadership development. Between his Yearling and Cow years, he completed the Army Space Cadre Basic Course as part of his Advanced Individual Academic Development (AIAD), earning the prestigious 3Y "Space Enabler" skill identifier. This accomplishment led to a follow-on AIAD with the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency (NGA), where Jack's contributions were recognized with a Leadership Award for Excellence from the Director of the Office of Geography. While much of his research at the NGA remains classified, his work has further solidified his interest in human geography and intelligence.

Outside of academics, Jack's passion lies with the Skeet & Trap Club. He became the Cadet-in-Charge at the end of his Yearling year and was later promoted to captain. Jack's leadership helped propel the team to continued success, including an undefeated record against the other service academies and consistent top finishes in collegiate competitions nationwide. Last semester, he was the high overall shooter at the National Championship, where the West Point Skeet and Trap team secured a spot on the podium for the third consecutive year.

In addition to his leadership on the shooting range, Jack has been an active participant in intramural football each year of his cadet career. His leadership skills were further showcased during Cow summer, where he served as a Beast Squad Leader, guiding new cadets through one of the most challenging experiences at West Point. He continued his role as a squad leader in the first semester of his Cow year and currently serves as the Company H2 S2/S6, managing public affairs and IT for his unit.

This past summer, Jack completed his Cadet Troop Leader Training (CTLT) as the executive officer (XO) for an Armor Basic Combat Training (BCT) company at Fort Moore. Looking ahead, Jack has his sights set on a career in Field Artillery, with aspirations of eventually becoming a Functional Area-40 Space Officer.

Anthony Tinerella

Academic Major: Civil Engineering



Anthony Tinerella, a 2017 graduate of Barron Collier High School, has exemplified a deep commitment to service and leadership throughout his military journey. With a strong desire to serve, Anthony enlisted in the Army immediately after high school, where he completed Basic Training, Advanced Individual Training (AIT), and Airborne School. After successfully passing the Ranger Indoctrination Program, he was assigned to the elite 75th Ranger Regiment. In 2020, Anthony deployed to Afghanistan before transitioning to the U.S. Military Academy Prep School (USMAPS) and subsequently entering West Point with the Class of 2025 in the summer of 2021.

Anthony's time at West Point has been marked by a wide range of academic, athletic, and leadership accomplishments. Following his Plebe year, he earned the Air Assault Badge. He also participated in an Academic Individual Advanced Development (AIAD) program through the Geography and Environmental Engineering Department, where he took part in a unique "storm chasing" project. From Nebraska to New Mexico, Anthony and his team observed F1-F2 tornadoes and visited the National Weather Center in Norman, Oklahoma, as well as several Air Force bases to study how weather technology is used in military training.

Between his Yearling and Cow years, Anthony served as a Squad Leader during the challenging Beast Barracks, guiding new cadets through their initial West Point experience. He continues to take on leadership roles, including overseeing Fourth Class Development Training and serving as the Company G4 Historian.

Athletically, Anthony has been a dedicated member of the Crew team throughout his cadet career, rising to the position of Crew Commodore (Team Captain). His leadership and skill led to his selection as one of five cadets to compete in the prestigious Head of the Charles Regatta last year. Additionally, he has been a key member of the cannon crew during Army football games for the past four years, further showcasing his school spirit and dedication.

Academically, Anthony is involved in a Capstone Project in collaboration with the Army Corps of Engineers and the Engineer Research and Development Center, where he applies his knowledge to solve real-world challenges. Building on his prior experience in flight training while enlisted at Fort Benning, Anthony received a West Point-sponsored scholarship after his Yearling year to complete his private pilot's license, adding yet another impressive achievement to his resume.

This past summer, Anthony completed his Cadet Troop Leader Training (CTLT) as the executive officer (XO) for an Infantry One Station Unit Training (OSUT) company at Fort Moore. He also managed to join the 3rd Ranger Battalion for night training exercises, further deepening his connection to the Ranger community. His branch preference is Infantry, with the goal of returning to the 75th Ranger Regiment as a commissioned officer.

Katherine Ward, a 2021 graduate of Riverview Senior High School, has made remarkable strides since her appointment to the United States Military Academy at West Point. Entering West Point the summer following her graduation, Katie has exemplified dedication, leadership, and academic excellence throughout her cadet career. Katie's passion for cheerleading took center stage during her time at West Point. She serves as the Captain of the Rabble Rousers, the Academy's cheerleading team, during her Firstie year.

In addition to supporting Army teams on the sidelines, her team competed in intercollegiate cheer competitions, including Nationals in Daytona. She also took part in a Physical Individual Advanced Development (PIAD) program focused on cheer, honing her skills further over the summer. Beyond athletics, Katie has proven herself in other challenging endeavors. After her Plebe year, she earned the Air Assault Badge and achieved Black Heavy Combat Ready Status on the Army Combat Fitness Test (ACFT), a rare accomplishment, especially for a female cadet. She also contributed to a research group working on improving the efficiency of lithium-ion battery packs by making them lighter and smaller. Katie also met the rigorous Indoor Obstacle Course Test (IOCT) graduation requirement early, "tabbing" it during her Cow year.

Between her Yearling and Cow years, she served as a Squad Leader for the Summer Leadership Experience (SLE), guiding high school candidates through their West Point experience. Katie's leadership skills continued to develop through her selection to the prestigious Gettysburg Leadership Seminar in both her Cow and Firstie summers. She also held key leadership roles, including serving as Company C-1 First Sergeant in the first semester of Cow year and as the Regimental S1 NCO in the second semester. Now, as a Cadet Captain, she leads the Brigade Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC), representing all team captains.

Katie has also been active in outreach efforts through the Cadet Ambassador Program (CAP), where she worked with Admissions to engage with prospective cadet candidates globally. This included conducting interviews and answering questions from interested students. Her academic achievements are equally impressive, having made the Dean's List for the past three semesters. Her upcoming Capstone Project will focus on mental health issues within the military, aiming to address and reduce the growing suicide rates among service members.

Last summer, Katie completed her Cadet Troop Leader Training (CTLT) in Hawaii, focusing on the Adjutant General Corps, her top branch preference as she nears graduation. Katie Ward continues to embody the spirit of excellence and service, representing Riverview Senior High School and West Point with pride.





DID YOU KNOW?

Who and What is Benny Havens?

"Benny Havens" refers to Benjamin Havens, a tavern keeper who operated a popular establishment near the United States Military Academy at West Point, New York, where he was affectionately called "Benny" by the cadets. His tavern became a frequent spot for cadets to visit, leading to a famous song "Benny Havens, Oh" still sung by West Point's Glee Club today, commemorating his legacy of providing food and drink to the cadets, even though it was considered "off-limits" due to strict academy rules.

Key points about Benny Havens and West Point:

The Tavern Keeper:

- Benjamin Havens ran a tavern located near the Hudson River below Buttermilk Falls, close to the West Point.

Cadet Patronage:

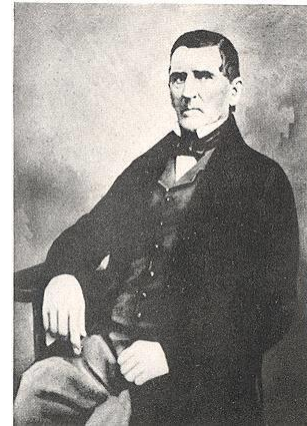
- Cadets, including notable figures like Edgar Allan Poe, George Armstrong Custer, and Jefferson Davis, would often visit Benny's tavern despite potential disciplinary action for leaving the academy grounds.

The "Benny Havens, Oh" Song:

- A famous song titled "Benny Havens, Oh" was written in honor of the tavern keeper, capturing the sentiment of cadets enjoying their time at his establishment.

Legacy:

- Today grads meet under the calling of Benny Havens to re-connect, share old memories and make new ones.

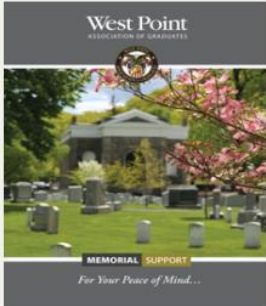
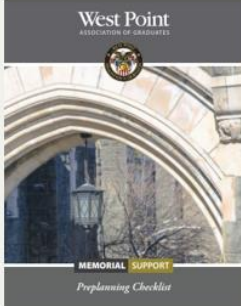

The Veterans Volunteer Services Liaison (VVSL) is a newly created position within Societies and Classes, designed for individuals working in Veterans Services careers or those familiar with the Veterans Services or VA Benefits process. The VVSL's responsibilities include helping Society members or classmates navigate Veterans Services, providing information and guidance on available resources, and maintaining confidentiality and respect for privacy. The role requires attending monthly training webinars (30-60 minutes) and offering assistance on a case-by-case basis. This position is essential for leveraging the skills and passion of graduates with Veterans Services experience to support fellow grads locally or within their class. 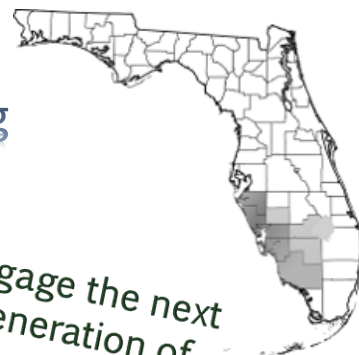
